Cyber Attacks – Remain vigilant

Email remains the top attack method on the Internet today. Criminals and foreign espionage services are continually refining the types of messages they use to trick victims into clicking links or opening attachments containing ransomware, spyware, adware, viruses, other malware, or links to fake websites to steal your account credentials for Amazon, Google, Microsoft, banks, etc. Many of these looks very authentic and may impersonate your Internet account, banks, vendors, or anyone else they believe you may do business with.

REMEMBER, BCT WILL NEVER SEND YOU A SYSTEM MESSAGE FROM ANONYMOUS ACCOUNTS!

All of our messages will come from someone you know on our management and operations team. You should delete or report any messages you see that pretend to be from Administrator, Scanner, HR, Outlook, ADP, etc.

We will never ask you for your cell phone number or text you requests to buy gift cards.
